Directed Reading Program

The Directed Reading Program is a one-to-one mentoring program between graduate and undergraduate students working on a reading project in mathematics, which is extracurricular (does not count for credit/no tuition). We encourage students from all majors and with all levels of mathematical background to apply

When you register to the program as an undergraduate student, you can specify a topic of interest. You will then be paired with a graduate student mentor, either with similar interests, or with someone who has a suggested project for you. During the semester, you will have weekly reading assignments as well as a weekly meeting with your mentor. At the end of the semester, all the undergraduate students participating in the Directed Reading Program give a presentation on what they read during the semester.

The goal of the program is to give undergraduate students an opportunity to study a topic in more detail and with more individual attention than it is possible in a classroom setting, to give undergraduate students experience explaining mathematical concepts in conversations and presentations, and to increase interaction between undergraduate and graduate students in the math department.
